August 19, 2026

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of La Vista convened in open and public session at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 19, 2026.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Papillion Times on August 12, 2026. Simultaneously given to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee, and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt is attached to the minutes. The availability of the agenda was communicated in advance notice to the members. All proceedings hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to attendance of the public. Further, all subjects discussed in the meeting were contained in the agenda, which was available for inspection within ten working days prior to the meeting.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Director Heather Buller called the meeting to order.

- a. Director Heather Buller announced the location of the Open Meetings Act for public reference and read the Emergency Procedures Statement.

2. ROLL CALL

Present was Vice-Chair Pat Lodes, Members Samantha Gentry, Josephine Pohl, Shaina Owen, and Sarah Lara-Toney. City Staff present was Recreation Director Heather Buller, Parks Superintendent Jason Allen, and Administrative Specialist Kimmy Ludwick.

3. CONSENT AGENDA

- a. Buller asked for a motion to approve the agenda for the meeting of August 19 and the minutes of the June 17 meeting. Motion made by member Gentry, seconded by member Pohl. All aye. Motion approved.

5. DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS

- a. Discussion and Action on recommendation of Recreation Fee amendments to Master Fee Ordinance. Proposed fees and benchmarked fees of comparable cities were presented to the board. Questions about participation and new fees were addressed. Member Owen made a motion to approve a recommendation of the proposed fees, seconded by member Lara-Toney. All Aye. Motion Approved
- b. Discussion on La Vista Sports Complex Baseball Field RFP. The Board received a presentation on the planning and design of the proposed new baseball field at the La Vista Sports Complex. The presentation included an overview of the project and the current design considerations.
- c. Discussion on Camenzind Park Playground Project. The Board reviewed the Camenzind Park renovation survey and provided feedback regarding which questions were necessary and which could be removed from the public input process. Members suggested conducting door-to-door outreach to gather face-to-face feedback from residents and build stronger connections within the community. Members noted that previous door-to-door outreach had resulted in positive feedback and increased community engagement, including a larger turnout at the playground ribbon-cutting event.
- d. Discussion on City Park Playground Renovations. Photos highlighting the recent updates and improvements to City Park were presented to the Board. An overview of the playground ribbon-cutting event was also provided.
- e. Discussion on Pool Update. The pool team is fine-tuning decisions regarding brands and materials that will best meet the City's long-term needs. Consideration is being given to selecting materials and equipment that are durable, readily available, and easily repairable without requiring specialized equipment or difficult-to-obtain replacement parts.

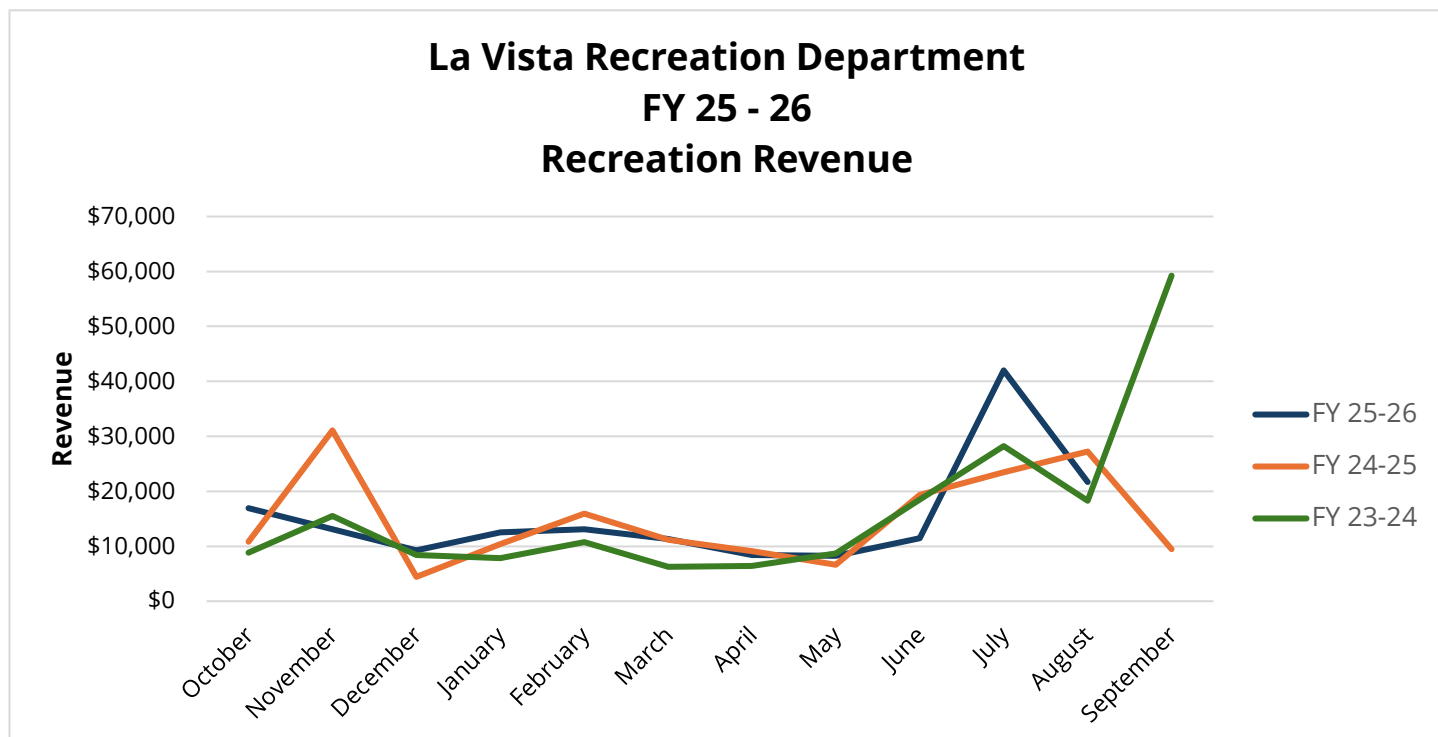
- Pool Design
 - Entered into an engineering services agreement with Water's Edge Aquatic Design for \$464,100 approved at City Council October 21. Scope of work outlined in the agreement includes site evaluation, schematic design, design development, construction documents, and assistance with the bidding process
 - The proposed facility will include approximately 8,000 square feet of water surface area, a bathhouse, concession facilities, filter building, pool deck, and entry sidewalk
 - Continued work on Design Development

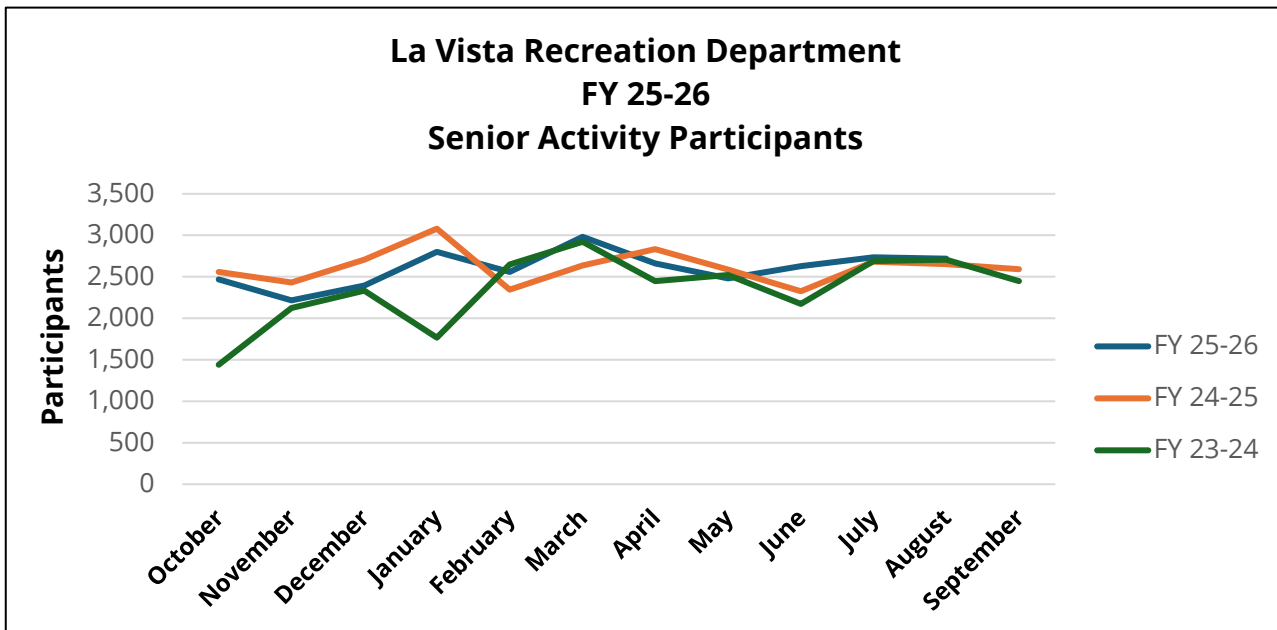

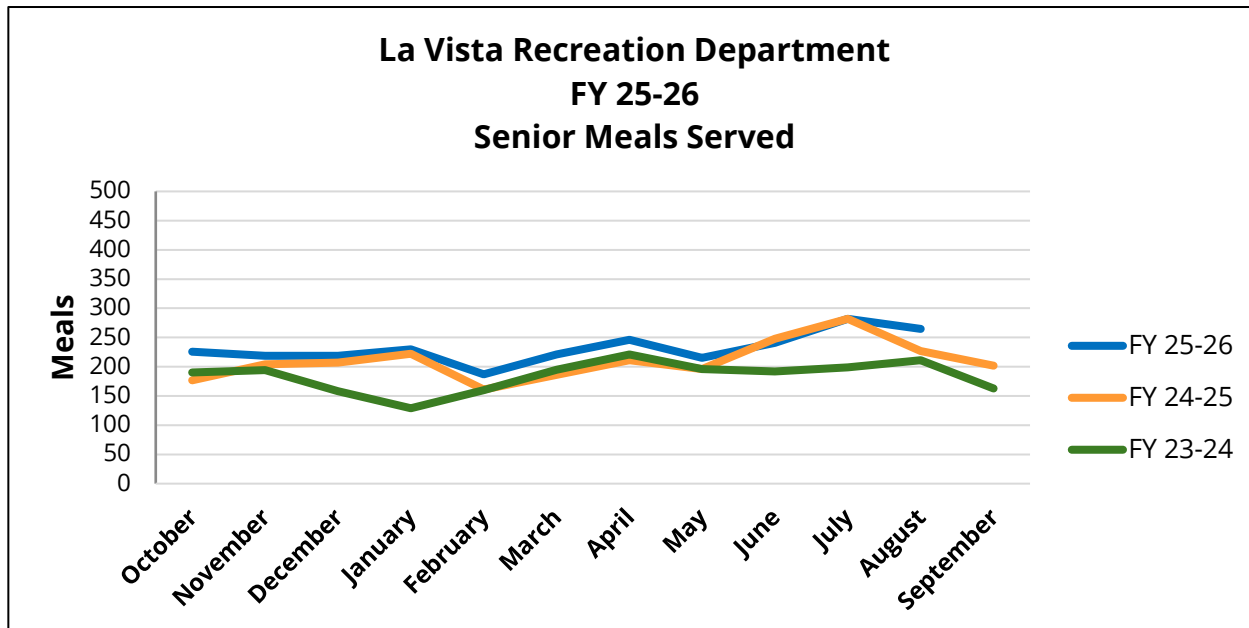

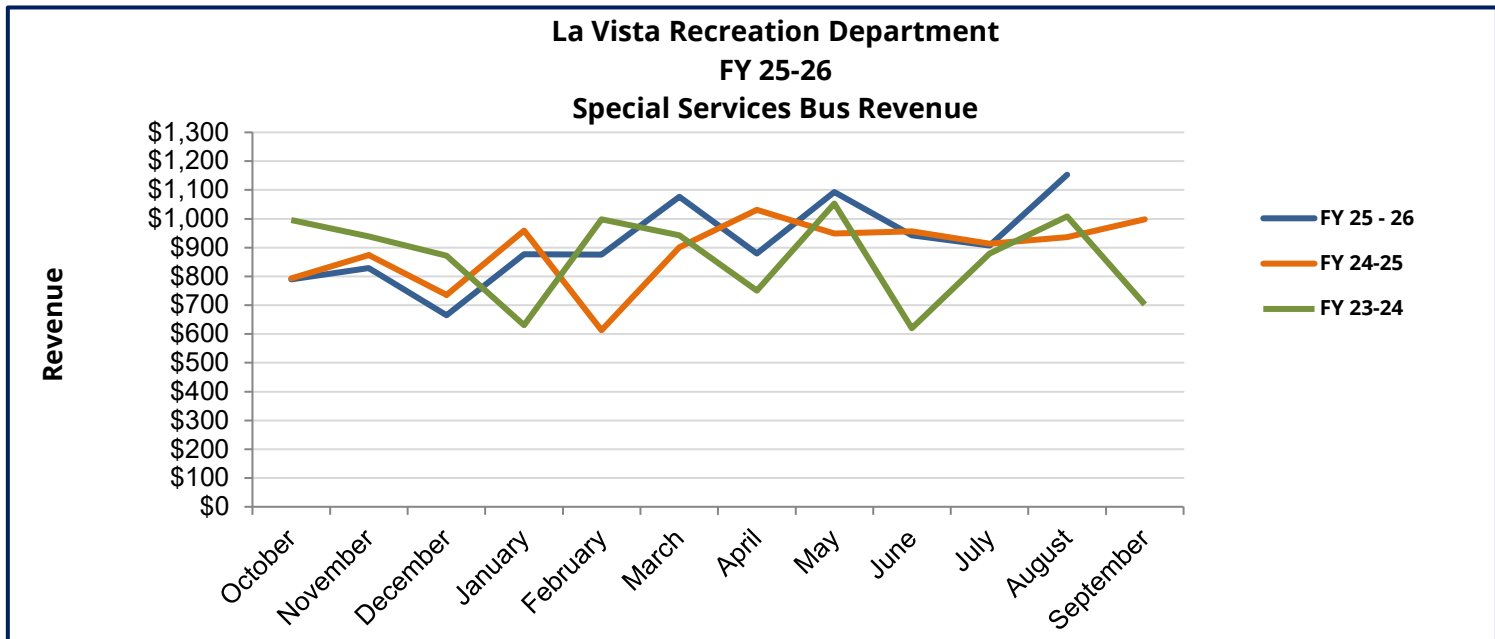
